Collaborative Complex Co-Occurring Disorder Treatment

Jaime's presentation will explore the biology, genetics, trauma, environment and life experience that contribute to the development of addiction and/or mental health disorders. We will discuss the importance of Collaborative, Integrated Treatment in healing the whole person, as well as family members, throughout the continuum of care. In addition we will provide case studies and examples of collaborative integrative treatment plans.

Jaime Vinck currently serves as Chief Operations Officer for Sierra Tucson. Jaime oversees the overall program design and implementation for all Sierra Tucson programs. Vinck is also an independently licensed clinician with a private practice in Scottsdale where she counsels couples and families struggling with addiction & mental illness.
